The History Education Network/Histoire et éducation en réseau (THEN/ HiER) is a national project that began in 2005, to enrich history education in Canada through practice-informed research and research-informed practice. The network aims to connect practising teachers, academic historians, history educators in faculties of education, historians in museums and at historic sites, archivists, and provincial curriculum policymakers.
