Intute, based in the United Kingdom, is "a free online service that helps you to find the best web resources for vour studies and research."

The Internet Scout Project is based at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Its "research team creates and delivers practical Web-based information and software solutions for educators, librarians and researchers." Both websites allow visitors to find materials related to their specific field of inquiry, free of charge.

the teams at the Vancouver Holocaust Education Centre and 7th Floor Media have created a brilliant web-based resource on Canada's response to the 1936 Berlin Olympics. Based on original research, it provides a rich but manageable array of primary documents from Canada in the 1930s, along with the background context necessary to work with those sources. Clear, well-structured lesson plans provide explicit links to the historical thinking concepts of the Benchmarks Project. This website will enable teachers to help students make sense of a historical dilemma with rich resonance for citizens in the 21st century. The Benchmarks of Historical Thinking, a project of the CSHC, held its national meeting, "A Big Step Forward: Historical Thinking in Provincial Curricula, Assessments and Professional Development" from 18-20 February at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Toronto. Meeting delegates included representatives from provincial social studies and history teachers' associations, provincial ministries of education, faculties of education, and textbook publishers. Issues discussed in small groups included accomplishments, challenges and needs in the areas of curriculum, assessment, professional development, and materials development.

The theme of the SCSS's 2010 annual meeting in Moose Jaw, March 4-5, is "Saskatchewan and the Great War: A Retrospective." The keynote speaker is Dr. Tim Cook of the Canadian War Museum.
